Scholarship

Every year we award the top two students a scholarship for their Leaving Certificate Exam. results. We also have an annual awards and achievement's day for all of our student's.

Junior Certificate School **Programme**

The Junior Certificate School Programme aims to provide a curriculum framework that assists schools and teachers in making the Junior Certificate more assessable to those young people who may leave school without formal qualifications. It attempts to help young people experience success and develop a positive self-image by providing a curriculum and assessment framework suitable to their needs. On completion of the programme students receive

a profile which is an official record of their achievements from the Department of Education and Science.



Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme

Under the L.C.V.P. programme our students are given the opportunity to study Leaving Certificate subjects and three link modules:

Enterprise Education

Preparation for Work

Work Experience

Students who take L.C.V.P. benefit in many ways in that they learn about the world of work and how to apply for, and undertake employment through career investigations. They will gain experience in using computers to prepare C.V.'s and formatting reports. They will be educated in operating as a member of a team and they will learn about enterprise and how to set up their own business in the future.



Transition Year in St.Tiernan's College

We introduced Transition Year for the first time to St. Tiernan's College in September 2015. It has been a very exciting undertaking for both staff and students and has created a great atmosphere of anticipation within the school.

We have crafted a Programme that is crammed full of new experiences which are fun-filled, busy and very worthwhile.

To give you a flavour of the kind of activities Transition Years will typically engage in this is a sample of events in this year's programme. Transition Year students are currently busy with involvement in the Schools Business Partnership in conjunction with Ballina Beverages and are

liaising with Bank of Ireland for the 'Build a Bank Challenge'. They are experiencing the fun of cross-curricular partnerships by integrating their Engineering Classes with their plans for Student Enterprise Awards. Students are forging deeper links with their community through Work Experience and our on-going links with The Cluainín Day-Centre. Our T.Y Programme in St.Tiernan's College is built around the concepts of solidifying and increasing

knowledge of our core subjects, English, Irish, Maths and Science. All Transition Year students are encouraged to experience subjects offered at Senior Cycle, even those they have never tried before such as Home Economics, Engineering, French or Art.

Transition Year specific activities are timetabled weekly and students also participate in once off events such as Sci-Fest or College Open Days.

Alongside Physical Education as part of our curriculum, our sports programme is wide and varied and caters to the sporting interests of all our students.



Music

St. Tiernan's College runs a very popular after-school music club for our students. Students are given an opportunity to learn to play new instruments and also to perform in Christmas concerts and other

shows during the course of the year. St. Tiernan's College also produces a music production every second year which is very popular among both students and staff alike. Our most recents productions include

the X-Molina factor and Tiernan's got talent. Music generation is provided here at St. Tiernan's College. This initiative provides an opportunity to develop vocal ability and musical skills of various instruments to all ages.

Summer Camp

During the month of June/July we successfully run the St. Tiernan's College two day Summer Camp for potential First Year students free of charge. A wide range of activities are organised e.g. drumming workshops, arts and crafts, fun cookery classes and various sports. It is a great way for future classmates to meet (some for the first time) in a fun environment. They also have another chance to meet some of their teachers and familiarise themselves with the school buildings before school begins in August/September.

DEIS

St. Tiernan's College is now part of the new Department of Education and Science initiative DEIS. The aim of the new DEIS programme is to ensure that schools benefit from all available supports. It incorporates a School Completion Programme (SCP) which focuses on the retention of young people in education and also aims to develop local strategies to ensure maximum levels in the education process. It aims to involve

both primary and post primary schools, parents, relevant statutory, voluntary and community agencies. The following activities are provided within the school as a result of our inclusion in the DEIS programme.



Lunch Club

All students are members of the lunch club and each receive a sandwich, drink (water/ or orange juice) and a piece of fruit daily, free of charge, funded by the DEIS initiative.

Evening Study

Evening Study is available for students Three evenings a week from 3.50 to 5.50 p.m. It is fully supervised and provided free-of-charge.

Students are encouraged to participate in the many and varied range of extracurricular activities and so develop skills and competencies in many areas.



In St Tiernan's College we always strive to provide each student with the best opportunities to reach their full potential. Part of exam success is the knowledge on how best to revise and study, keeping in mind that there we all learn in different ways we introduce study skills through our S.P.H.E classes that are provided at junior and senior level. We also support this by engaging with seminars provided by "Super Generation". These seminars include practical guidance delivered in an enjoyable and accessible manner that our students have found beneficial.

Home School Community Ligison Officer

We also now have the continued support of a Home School Liaison Officer which we see as an invaluable resource between home and school.









Schools Business Partnership

St. Tiernan's College have been lucky enough to link with Ballina Beverages through the School Business Partnership Programme for the last number of years.

This Programme provides our TY students with a unique insight into the world of work. There are usually five sessions overall in the programme. During these sessions, students are provided with the opportunity to learn about the partnering company, it's business and to consider careers and further study options available

to them when they finish school. Sessions involve a site visit, CV writing skills, mock interviews, Day in the Life insights and at the conclusion the class present their learnings. The HR department in Ballina Beverages conduct the mock interviews in a local hotel and this is an invaluable experience for young students who

would never have experienced preparing for and performing in a professional business interview. Ballina Beverages have also incorporated a team building session each year early on in the programme. This has involved a Murder Mystery days and a cycle on the Greenway which have proved to be great fun.

Parents' Council

St. Tiernan's College has an active Parents' Council. The Council is open to all parents who have students in the College. It meets regularly and has a positive impact on the life of the College.

Learning Support
